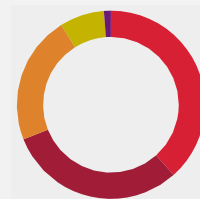

market commentary

Asia Pacific ex Japan equities slid during the quarter, amid risks of faster interest rate hikes in the US and a potential trade-war between the US and China. Broadly positive economic data and improved corporate earnings forecasts buoyed Chinese equities. Thai and Taiwanese markets led gains, aided by encouraging earnings reports. The Indian market, however, slid following the introduction of a long-term capital gain tax on equities and the emergence of a debt fraud at a state-owned lender. South Korean and Indonesian equities retreated as corporate results missed expectations. Australian markets also slid as competitive pressures and regulatory concerns weighed on telecommunications and banking stocks, respectively. All sectors in the region, except utilities, ended in negative territory. Of note, materials, financials and consumer discretionary holdings were the key laggards.
