

market commentary

US equities rallied in the third quarter, posting the highest gains since the fourth quarter of 2013. Stock prices were supported by strong economic growth, robust corporate earnings, rising crude oil prices and easing tensions over global trade frictions. Meanwhile, Canada, Mexico and the US reached a new trade deal called the United States-Mexico-Canada Agreement (USMCA) to replace the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA) just before the September 30 deadline. As widely expected, the US Federal Reserve (Fed) raised the interest rate range by 0.25 percentage points in September, and signalled one more rate hike this year. All sectors generated positive returns, with health care and industrials among the leading gainers. Growth stocks outperformed their value peers, albeit by a narrower margin. In terms of market capitalisation, large-cap companies outperformed their mid-cap peers.
