
# the DC funds

Emerging Markets Equities – **active**as at 31 March 2018


## fund objective

## market commentary

Emerging market equities fell in sterling terms, but rose in US dollar terms. Upbeat economic growth in China and robust US manufacturing data boosted investors' appetite for riskier assets. However, gains were limited due to concerns over a trade war between the US and China. Expectations of a higher-than-expected number of interest rate hikes by the US Federal Reserve (Fed) also weighed on sentiment. The new Fed Chairman Jerome Powell raised rates in March and indicated the possibility of two more hikes in 2018. In Asia, Chinese stocks rose as the government's plan to reform H-shares of companies listed in Hong Kong was well-received by markets. Elsewhere, Brazilian equities advanced on encouraging political news and expectations of an economic recovery in 2018. Against this backdrop, stocks in the energy, health care and financials sectors rose.

That's why putting more of your DC pension pot into bonds to try to match annuity prices as you get closer to retirement age can help protect against this risk.	High
