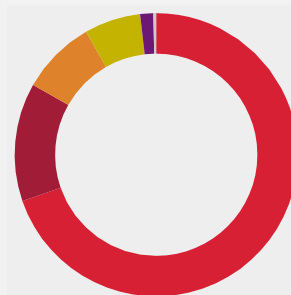

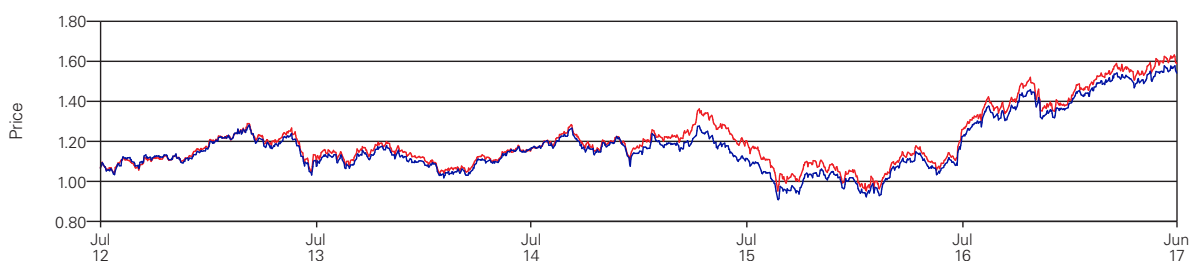

market commentary

Emerging markets advanced as robust economic data from China, prospects of tax cuts in the US and the victory of a centrist candidate in the French Presidential elections boosted investors' appetite for riskier assets. Both the US and Europe are key export destinations for emerging countries. The US Federal Reserve raised interest rates in June amid an improving job market. In Asia, Chinese shares rose on the back of encouraging manufacturing data and easing liquidity concerns in money markets. MSCI's decision to include certain mainland listed stocks on its emerging markets index also supported sentiment. Elsewhere, Turkish stocks advanced after citizens bestowed additional executive powers on President Recep Tayyip Erdogan. Against this backdrop, stocks in the information technology and consumer sectors advanced.
