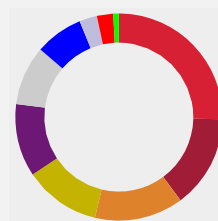

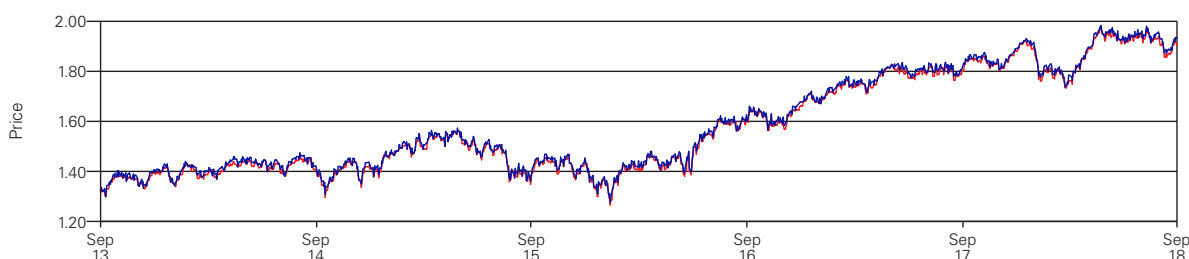

## market commentary

UK equities declined during the third quarter, as investor sentiment was weighed down by uncertainty related to Brexit negotiations. Hopes for a softer Brexit suffered a setback as there was no breakthrough in Brexit talks between the UK and European Union (EU) at their summit meeting in Austria. As a result, investors are cautious ahead of the looming Brexit deadline. In addition, concerns over an escalation of the trade war between the US and China, and its impact on global growth weighed on market sentiment. On a market-cap basis, mid-cap stocks, which are domestically focussed, were the biggest decliners amid an uncertain economic outlook. On the policy front, the Bank of England raised interest rates for the second time in a decade. The central bank increased interest rates by a quarter of a percentage point, from 0.5% to 0.75%, the highest level since March 2009.

Pension conversion risk is the risk that the amount of income you can buy drops before you retire, because your money is invested differently to annuity funds. That's why putting more of your DC pension pot into bonds to try to match annuity prices as you get closer to retirement age can help protect against this risk.	High
