

## market commentary

Emerging market equities delivered strong performance over the quarter. Progress in US-China trade talks and expectations of encouraging manufacturing data in China lifted sentiment towards riskier assets. However, concerns over Chinese growth weighed slightly on equities. Chinese stocks rose after the MSCI announced that it would substantially increase exposure to mainland shares in its indices. Shares were further supported by signs that Chinese government policy would support credit growth. In the country's annual legislative session, Chinese policymakers promised to implement tax cuts and infrastructure funding over the year to boost economic growth. In Latin America, Brazilian stocks advanced as the new government announced reform measures. However, gains were limited by the arrest of former President Michel Temer on graft charges. Russian stocks rose amid higher oil prices, notwithstanding the risks of additional sanctions by the US.
