

asset breakdown





#### market commentary

Index-linked UK government bonds (Gilts) posted negative returns and underperformed nominal Gilts. Ten-year UK inflation breakevens (the yield differential between nominal and inflation-linked government bonds of the same maturity) ended marginally higher over the quarter. Global breakevens rose to the end of August amid a continued rally in equities and oil prices. The release of more positive inflation data and news that the US Federal Reserve (Fed) is moving to an average inflation targeting framework also supported inflation-linked bonds. Under this framework, the Fed will allow inflation to moderately overshoot its 2% target for some time, to compensate for persistently low inflation in the run-up to the pandemic, thus eliminating concerns that it may increase interest rates to combat inflation anytime soon. However, global breakevens fell in September, as the post-COVID-19 rebound in equities came to an end.
