



market commentary

UK equities continued their upward trend in the second quarter, with strong gains registered in April and June. Against a weakening macroeconomic backdrop, global central banks indicated further monetary policy easing, which supported investors' appetite for higher risk assets. Comments from European Central Bank (ECB) President Mario Draghi also suggested fresh stimulus measures. Meanwhile, Brexit has been delayed until 31 October, as European leaders agreed to extend the deadline. On the policy front, the Bank of England maintained interest rates at 0.75%, even as it cautioned about increased downside risks to growth. At a sector level, technology and industrials stocks were the major gainers, while telecommunications and utilities lagged the broader market. From a style perspective, growth stocks performed better than value stocks.
