



#### market commentary

Index-linked UK government bonds (Gilts) posted positive returns. Inflation rose to 3.1% in November, the highest level in nearly six years. UK government bond markets were supported as yields fell amid stretched positioning and ongoing uncertainty around "Brexit" negotiations, and as investors had already priced in an interest rate increase by the Bank of England (BoE).
